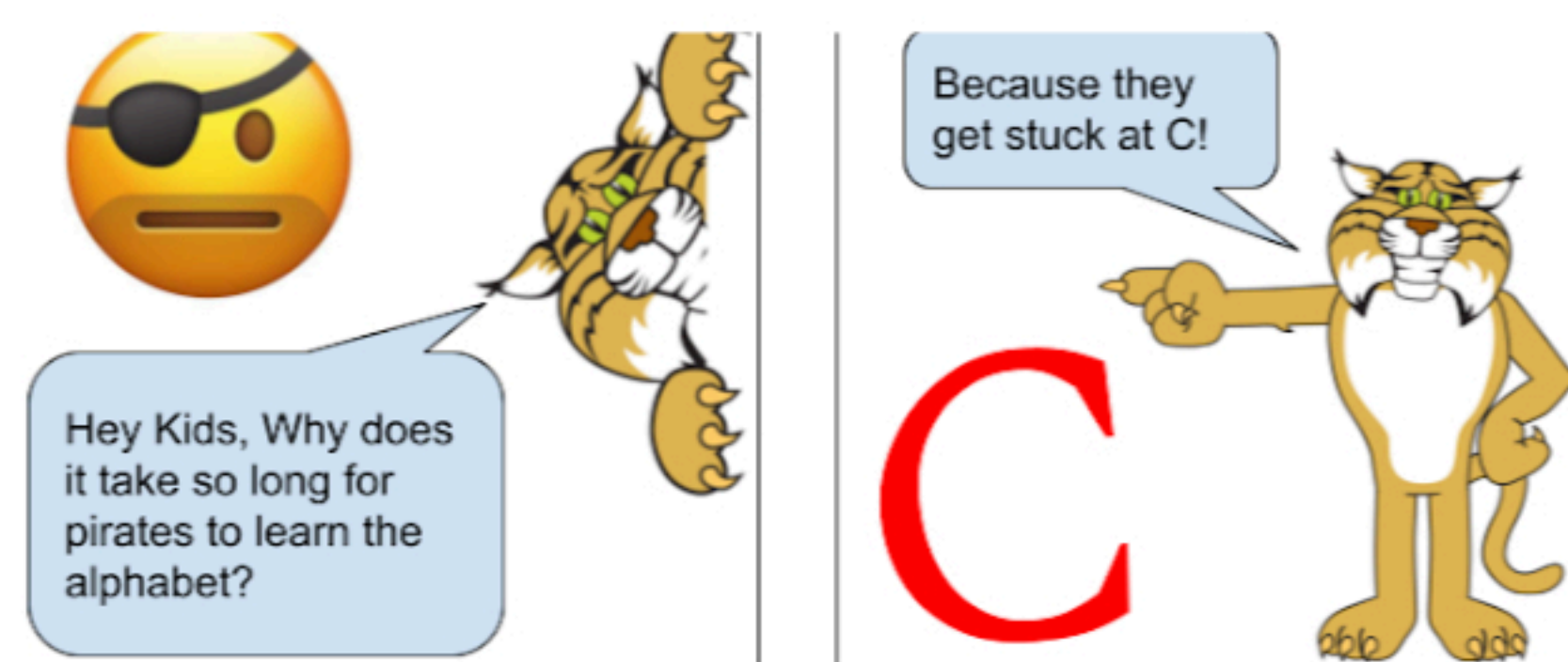
it was a game everyone could play." Seventh grader Liana Khimich said she liked the pumpkins.
